He is currently the Director General of the State Interest and Governance

Authority (SIGA).

Asamoah Boateng was born in 1958 and hails from Konongo in the Ashanti Region of Ghana. He attained his basic education at the Konongo Methodist primary school, Kormantse District Assembly Middle Schools and Jasikan Roman Catholic Middle school and then proceeded to obtain his senior high school education at Konongo/Odumase Senior High School.
